



Issue:

To extend, beyond March 31, the removal of parking restrictions imposed on streets with bicycle lanes.

Discussion – Background and Current Status:

On September 28, 2015, Council approved motion SJMC2015-09-28/451R, Moved – Councillor Puddister; Seconded – Deputy Mayor Ellsworth:

That Council rescind its decision of July 26, 2010, with respect to the approval of the Cycling Master Plan insofar as to remove all parking restrictions imposed on streets with bicycle lanes during the winter months from the period of November 1 - March 31 of each year, and that this be implemented starting November 1, 2015.

On February 8, 2016, Council passed motion SJMC2016-02-08/63R which formed the Bike St. John's Task Force. During the discussion on this matter, Councillor Puddister indicated that he intends to make a notice of motion to extend beyond March 31, the removal of parking restrictions imposed on streets with bicycle lanes.

On February 24, 2016, the Bike St. John's Task Force had its inaugural meeting. During this meeting the Council Directive to form the Task Force (CD# R2016-02-08/8) was reviewed. This Council Directive included the intended notice of motion mentioned above.

The possibility of allowing parking in bicycle lanes going forward was discussed by the Task Force. Several questions were raised including:

- How many complaints have been received and what is the exact nature of these complaints? It would be helpful to understand the specific issues in order to try and find a solution that serves the needs of all residents.
- Is there a liability issue should a cyclist be injured as a result of this policy?
- How long would this extension last? From an engineering perspective a long term extension is functionally equivalent to complete removal of bicycle lanes and, in this case, the signage and on street markings should be modified to reflect this.



The next step identified for the Bike St. John's Task Force is to complete a review of the current state of cycling in the City of St. John's. This review will take into consideration the views and concerns of a wide variety of City residents; the current information on hand in city reports and plans; and, the existing transportation infrastructure provided by the City.

Key Considerations/Implications:

1. Budget/Financial Implications:

The extension of this policy calls for changes to signage and on street markings. This would come at the cost of time spent on other street maintenance activities. Further, if the bicycle lanes are reinstated, in part or whole, as a result of the Task Force review, then there will be costs to replace the signs and markings.

As there is currently some uncertainty with respect to the future of bicycle lanes in the City, the expense of repainting bicycle lanes and replacing bicycle signs has been deferred until such time as clear direction is provided by Council.

- 3. Alignment with Strategic Directions/Adopted Plans The existing bicycle lanes contribute to these strategic directions and goals:

 - Promote active and healthy living

On balance, the extension being considered would negatively affect these goals. Note, however, that parking service levels would improve.

Conclusion/Next Steps:

Council has given the Task Force a mandate to review the issue of the existing bike lanes. Extending the removal of parking restrictions, especially during the summer months, effectively decides this issue before the Council mandated review can take place.

In consideration of this and the implications identified above, the Bike St. John's Task Force feels that it is premature to extend beyond March 31 the removal of parking restrictions imposed on streets with bicycle lanes.

Should the intended motion be brought forward, the Bike St. John's Task Force recommends to Council that the temporary lifting of parking restrictions on streets with bicycle lanes be allowed to lapse on March 31, as originally approved, and that the underlying concerns be resolved through the review and subsequent recommendations of the Task Force.

Finally, the Bike St. John's Task Force would encourage any Councillor who has received complaints or comments related to this, or any other cycling issue, to forward them to the City's Transportation Engineer so that they can be included in the Task Force review.

Decision/Direction Required:

That Council adopt-in-principle the resolutions for St. John's Municipal Plan Amendment Number 137, 2016, and St. John's Development Regulations Amendment Number 628, 2016, to add personal care home as a discretionary use in the Rural (R) Zone for land at 729 Fowler's Road.

Discussion – Background and Current Status:

A public meeting chaired by Councillor Puddister was held on February 24, 2016, to review an application from Teen Challenge Canada. Minutes of the meeting are attached. The application is to develop a personal care home on 16.8 hectares (or 41.5 acres) of the 53-hectare (130-acre) property at 729 Fowler's Road (the former Circle Square Ranch). The facility will be used year-round for residential addictions recovery and treatment for up to 25 adult women and up to eight (8) residential care staff. For the first three years the facility would accommodate 12 women and two (2) counsellors. Teen Challenge will provide a 12-month program of vocational and life-skills training, including potentially an agricultural component of growing vegetables, operating greenhouses, and harvesting berries and Christmas trees.

The application will require approximately 1.6 kilometres of road upgrading, as this section of Fowler's Road does not meet City standards for year-round use, particularly where the proposed development would increase the number of people living along the road in the winter months. The cost of upgrading the road will be borne by the developer.

The proposed use is not an included land use in the Rural (R) Zone, so a text amendment would be required, as well as a text amendment to the St. John's Municipal Plan. The proposed amendments are attached.

Recommendation:

It is recommended that Council adopt-in-principle the attached resolutions for St. John's Municipal Plan Amendment Number 137, 2016, and St. John's Development Regulations Amendment Number 628, 2016, to add personal care home as a discretionary use in the Rural (R) Zone. These would accommodate the group home proposed by Teen Challenge Canada for residential addictions rehabilitation and treatment for up to 25 women and up to eight (8) staff at 729 Fowler's Road. The cost of road upgrades is to be borne by the developer.

If the amendments are adopted-in-principle by Council, they will be sent to the Department of Municipal Affairs with a request for provincial release. Once the release is received, the amendments will be referred back to a future regular meeting of Council for consideration of formal adoption and the appointment of a commissioner to conduct a public hearing, as required by the Urban and Rural Planning Act.

Public Meeting Wednesday, February 24, 2016 7:00 p.m. Foran/Greene Room, 4th Floor, City Hall

There were 3 people in attendance at the meeting.

PURPOSE OF MEETING

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the following application:

An application has been received for property located on 729 Fowler's Road by Teen Challenge Canada. They have applied for a site-specific amendment to the text of the Development Regulations (introduce a "Group Home with an agricultural/forestry component" as a use which could be allowed in the Rural Zone) to accommodate an application to redevelop 10 acres of an 130-acre property situated at 729 Fowler's Road (the former Circle Square Ranch) to a year-round residential addictions recovery and treatment facility. For the first three years the facility would accommodate 12 women and two counsellors.

No written submissions were received.

CALL TO ORDER AND BACKGROUND PRESENTATIONS

Councillor Puddister called the meeting to order, introduced the head table and defined the process for this meeting. The Chief Municipal Planner, Mr. Ken O'Brien, outlined the planning review process as referenced in the memo dated February 15, 2015 from him to the Planning & Development Standing Committee. In addition, the following documents were also included in the public meeting agenda:

- Location Map
- Amendment 137 of the St. John's Municipal Plan
- Amendment 628 of the St. John's Development Regulations

The Chief Municipal Planner gave an overview of the project noting that the Teen Challenge application was for the former Circle Square Ranch. He explained that the application did not involve rezoning just an amendment to the zone to add land use personal care home. Mr. O'Brien advised that it is a very large property of approximately 130 acres of which 41 acres will be used for a round year group home for 25 women and 8 staff. He further expressed that after following up with Public Works and the Regional Fire Department a widened paved road had to be provided for snow clearing operations and emergency response. The proponent had agreed to incur the paving road costs. Mr. O'Brien concluded that the town of CBS were also notified and as no feedback was received he assumed there were no concerns.

Glenn Barnes representing Teen Challenge gave some history on the international organization advising that it exists in 100 countries with 1,000 centres and had been in Canada for over 40 years. He stated it was a growing organization with a mandate to provide 12 month programs for both men and woman. The purpose of the centre is to provide counselling, life skills, vocational training, reintroduction to family, and the job market. He said 729 Fowler's Road is ideal as it is rural, quiet and therapeutic. Mr. Barnes noted there is a house on site with a pool and pond at this location. Mr. Barnes noted the pool and surrounding trails would be upgraded. He further stated the older camp buildings will be demolished and the dining hall will be repurposed to have training office space and a chapel. There will be an extension for a sleeping area. He noted the road would be paved right up to entrance gate and as the property would be using well and septic, an upgraded firefighting water storage tank would be provided from a safety perspective.

DISCUSSION FROM THE FLOOR

Fowler's Road

- expressed concern with residents hanging around his property as when the Centre operated as the Circle Square Ranch there would be 200 kids in the vicinity and some would be strolling along his property.
- The Chair expressed that residents should remain on the Teen Challenge property as they had 41 acres to use.

- Mr. Dan Murray from Teen Challenge advised that residents have strict supervision and guidance but they are not held against their will. He said residents have to be supervised whenever they leave the grounds such as doctor's appointments or dismissals. Mr. Murray noted that there are 6 centres across Canada and there never has been an issue. He further advised that you must be an adult to be part of the program with an average age of 35 years old attending.
- The Chair asked if surveillance cameras would be placed around the centre and Mr. Murray advised there would be.
- The Chair advised there wouldn't be 200 children using the facility and Mr. Murray further advised that it would take 4 to 5 years to reach 25 residents.
 - expressed concern with ATV usage.
- The Chair advised that as this was a rural area this problem was also found in Paradise, CBS and the Southern Shore. He further noted that with the road being paved to the centre, it should cut down on the usage as well as allow police to better monitor the area.
- felt the ATV issue would be far worse with the road paved as he had already had been involved in accident with an ATV.
- The Chair expressed this would fall under illegal activity and that more police patrols should be requested.

– Area Resident

• expressed encouraging the centre proceeding. He noted this centre was needed and that everyone deserved a second chance. In noted that Teen Challenge would be incorporating the costs so why not support it.

Fowler's Road

- further expressed concerns with hunting in the area.
- The Chair asked whether it was illegal hunting or just seasonal as permitted.
- noted seasonal hunting.
- The Chair advised that hunting signage could be placed along the roadside.
- expressed safety concerns in relation to hunting.
- The Chair stated that this would be a matter for Provincial Wildlife Division.

CONCLUDING REMARKS

Discussion – Background and Current Status:

An application to rebuild a dwelling on a non-conforming building lot was granted an approval-inprinciple by Council on January 6, 2014, with the following conditions:

- 1. Service NL approval for drilled well and septic disposal system;
- 2. The proposed dwelling must meet the yard requirements as stated in Section 10.42.3 of the St. John's Development Regulations; and
- 3. Meeting any necessary requirements of the Department of Planning, Development and Engineering.

Since the approval on January 6, 2014, the applicant has been consistently working on the development in order to meet the conditions for final approval, but has been met with significant challenges which were beyond his control, causing the approval-in-principle to expire.

In the spring of 2014 (April) work began on the septic system, tests were completed, however they ran into issues regarding the Biofilters, which took the rest of the summer to rectify. As no work could be completed in the winter, the house was removed in the spring of 2015. In 2015 NL Power had issues with the relocation of the power lines, which they worked to resolve. At the present time, the applicant is still working with Service NL to receive the well and septic approvals, however they now require a new municipal approval, as the original approval had recently expired on January 6, 2016.

The building lot is non-conforming in that it does not meet the minimum lot area of 2000m² required in the Rural Village (RV) Zone. Council approved the application under section 7.12.1.c), Non-Conforming Uses.

An Approval-in-Principle is valid for two years from date of granting by Council, during which time the applicant shall submit an application for Final Approval. As the conditions for approval were not met within the 2 year period which expired on January 6, 2016, he was not able to submit an application for final approval.


