Adoption of Minutes

SJMC2009-02-16/95R

It was decided on motion of Councillor Coombs; seconded by Councillor Duff: That the Minutes of the February 9th, 2009 meeting be adopted as presented.

New Metrobus Facility

Council considered a letter dated February 11, 2009 from Councillor Tom Hann, Chair, St. John's Transportation Commission regarding the new Metrobus facility.

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Councillor Hann noted that the Commission is progressing with the plans for the new Metrobus facility. The building requirements have been determined and cost estimates received. The Commission is recommending the construction of a sixty-four (64) bus facility at an estimated project cost of \$34,205,586.00. The current metrobus fleet has fifty-three (53) buses. This size of facility will meet current operational requirements and provide room for growth in the foreseeable future. \$26 million has been received from the Public Transit Capital Trust Fund which results in an additional funding requirement of \$8.2 million. The facility will be built to meet the international Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Green Building Standards. It is a benchmark for the design, construction and operation of high performance green buildings. By meeting these standards, it will result in energy efficiency, water savings and a reduction in greenhouse gas emissions and as such, will be a sustainable green building. Buildings meeting these standards are eligible to receive funding from the Green Fund administered by the Provincial Department of Environment and Conservation. The amount of additional funding will be reduced by the amount of funding that may be received from the Green Fund or other sources.

SJMC2009-02-16/96R

It was moved by Councillor Hann; seconded by Councillor Hanlon: That the City approve the additional funding in the amount of \$8.2 million required to construct a sixty-four (64) bus facility, noting there could be some savings because of a \$2 million escalation clause built into the project plans.

The motion being put was unanimously carried.

Snow Clearing and Ice Control of Downtown Sidewalks

Council considered as information a memorandum dated February 12, 2009 from the Director of Public Works and Parks regarding the above noted.

Councillor Hanlon

Councillor Hanlon noted she has had complaints that the sidewalk in the area of St. Andrews School, University Avenue, is very dangerous because of its incline. As indicated by staff, this year's budget does not contain funding allocation for salting of sidewalks and will be considered next year.

Councillor Hanlon noted that concern has been raised by residents in her Ward on the use of snowmobiles within the City, parks, trails etc. She tabled information on how other municipalities address the situation and asked that it be referred to the Public Works Committee with a view to finding ways to address the situation within the City.

Councillor Hanlon tabled information on the new crosswalk safety program taken on by the City of Halifax which involves flagging crosswalks, and asked that it be referred to the Police and Traffic Committee for consideration.

Councillor Hanlon advised that a meeting will be held on February 20, 2009 at City Hall the purpose of which is to meet with residents of Wishingwell Road to discuss the recent watermain break in their area.

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Councillor Hanlon tabled a letter from Mr. Rod Brown regarding the dangers associated with the disposal of dry cell batteries. The Associate Commissioner/Director of Engineering noted that the City's Household Hazardous Program provides a method of disposing of such items. He further noted that the new Robin Hood Bay facility will eventually look after hazardous waste collection. As noted by Mr. Tom Jackman in an email dated February 16, 2009 under a national program, Call2Recycle, batteries can be dropped off at Canadian Tire and Home Depot or any of the participating retailers.

Councillor Hanlon tabled an article titled "Canadian house sales drop again in January, agents report". She alluded to the fact that the largest year-over-year increase was noted in St. John's at 24.4 per cent.

Councillor Galgay

Councillor Galgay tabled a letter dated February 6, 2009 from Esther and Patrick Marshall, regarding excessive speeding on Pennywell Road, and asked that it be referred to the Police and Traffic Committee for consideration.

Councillor Puddister

Councillor Puddister referred to the Canada Lands proposed development for Pleasantville and questioned whether an environmental assessment would be carried out, expressing concern of the probability of oil tanks in the ground. The Director of Planning noted it is his understanding that as part of the process, Canada Lands has undertaken whatever environmental assessment is required, and indicated he would request that information.

Councillor Hickman

Councillor Hickman asked that the Public Works Committee look at any preventative measures that might be considered to control the pothole situation and avoid the potentially harmful consequences.
