1. Recreation & Parks Master Plan

Council during its Regular Meeting of October 29th, 2007 deferred the decision to award the Recreation & Parks Master Plan to the most qualified applicant, Tract Consulting, due to the additional \$56,000 required over and above the approved maximum of \$100,000. The matter was referred to this Committee for review. The Director of Recreation indicated that it had become clear during the review of the submitted proposals that the cost for the extent of work required as per the agreed upon Terms of Reference was simply underestimated. A total of three submissions were received, two of which were from organizations without any expertise in recreational planning. As a result, the submissions did not meet the requirements of the Terms of Reference. The Evaluations Committee unanimously agreed that the work be awarded to Tract Consulting, which is a locally-based company, having national affiliations. The Director of Recreation also assured that the consultant through the Recreation & Parks Master Plan Steering Committee will provide regular updates to Council on the progress of the Plan's development. With regard to the over-run in costs, the Departments of Recreation and Public Works will be able to utilize funds from their existing budgets to offset the additional \$56,000 required to undertake the Recreation & Parks Master Plan.

Based on the above noted clarifications and assurances that the cost of the Master Plan can be funded from existing approved budgets, the Committee recommends approval of the \$156,000 plus HST to undertake the Recreation & Parks Master Plan, and further that the contract be awarded to Tract Consulting as per the recommendation of the Evaluation Committee.

Report:

1. Energy Audit Study of City Buildings – MCW Maricor

The Committee met with Michael Gillis and Carmen Travis of MCW Maricor who provided an in-depth presentation summarizing the City's energy audit initiatives and recommendations for improving energy performance with municipal buildings. The City currently oversees approximately one million square feet of building space with annual utility expenditures of \$3 million. Due to the Department of Building & Property Management's energy retrofit which started in 1996, an average annual amount of \$270,000 has been realized in savings. The attached executive summary is for Council's information.

2. Meeting with Angus McKinley – Ryan's River Road

The Committee met with Mr. McKinley to discuss his concerns about the City's future intent to install a sewer service along Ryan's River Road. In 2001, he had questioned the status of the City's intent to install a water main along this road and was assured by the City that the item was not a scheduled capital works project. Based on this information, Mr. McKinley installed an artesian well at an approximate cost of \$5 - 6,000. Subsequent to this, Councillor Dinn was successful in convincing Council to fund the water line installation because he had received complaints from some residents of Ryan's River Road who had experienced lost water in their wells as a result of construction on Mountainview Drive. Mr. McKinley is now responsible for the \$3885 assessment for water line installation, despite the fact he does not require the service because of his new artesian well. Mr. McKinley is now faced with the dilemma of whether or not to install a septic system or if he should wait until Council decides to install this service. He was assured by staff that the matter is not recommended for the 2008 capital works list.

Mr. McKinley acknowledged the long-term likelihood of requiring access to these municipal services, but requested that Council provide him with an interest free assessment on them until such time as he actually requires hook-up.

It was agreed that the Director of Finance & City Treasurer would investigate the matter and contact Mr. McKinley to further discuss whether or not concessions or alternative solutions can be made.

3. <u>Electrical Permit Fees</u>

The Committee considered the attached Electrical Permit Fee structure.

The Committee recommends Council's adoption of the new electrical permit fee structure and that this be implemented on January 1, 2008.

4. <u>Plumbing Permit Fee Structure</u>

The Committee considered the memorandum dated October 11th, 2007 from the Director of Building & Property Management regarding the above noted. The Committee endorses his recommendation as follows:

That the City's Plumbing By-Law be amended to require contractors to provide the cost of materials and labour associated with work carried out under permit. This will allow the City to establish a plumbing permit structure in keeping with Building & Electrical permits which will ultimately result in a more appropriate fee for the work performed. It is anticipated that the information gathered in 2008 will allow a new fee structure to be implemented in 2009.
