1. The Murray Premises – Conversion of Space to Additional Hotel Rooms

The Committee met with representatives of Ron Fougere Associates as well as Mr. Bill Mahoney, owner of the Murray Premises. A copy of the proposed exterior renovations which will accommodate additional window openings are included with this report. The applicant has advised that the proposed five dormer windows which would be situated at the Beck's Cove side of the building will now be reduced to three, eliminating the two proposed exterior dormers. (An x is marked through these windows on the attached rendering). It should be noted that this is a heritage designated building.

The Committee recommends approval of the additional windows as outlined on the attached renderings with the exception of the two exterior dormers (marked with an x) which were noted by the applicant to be excluded from the plans submitted.

2. 8 Kenna's Hill – Stone House Property

The Committee met with representatives of Ron Fougere Associates to discuss their proposal to install a fire escape at the rear of the building to accommodate code standards for conversion of the building to offices. The Committee referenced the fact that this is both a provincial and municipal heritage designated structure, and stresses the importance of maintaining the original windows which are over 100 years old.

The Committee recommends that all original windows in this building be maintained as per the attached Statement of Significance prepared

by the Heritage Foundation, and that no changes be permitted to the original stone structure. The Committee therefore recommends against the alternative of a proposed fire escape exit at the location of an existing window in the original stone structure. The Committee recommends approval of the architect's second alternative that the fire escape exit be situated in the rear of the linhay, which will only affect the wooden portion of the linhay, which is a later addition, and will not require any changes to the original stone structure. The Committee has no objection to the demolition and reconstruction of the wooden structures to the rear of the linhay, as they are relatively recent additions that do not have any heritage significance. The Committee further recommends that the final renderings reflecting these recommendations be submitted to the Heritage Officer for final approval.

3. **Wesley United Church – 101 Patrick Street (Replacement of Fire Escapes**

The Committee considered the plans for the replacement of the fire escapes at 101 Patrick Street which is a heritage designated property. The fire escapes will be of steel construction similar to the existing with the addition of pickets to meet guard requirements of the National Building Code.

The Committee recommends approval of the replacement of fire escapes as submitted.

4. **354 Water St. (Sign Application)**

The Committee considered a sign application for 354 Water St. The sign is proposed to be installed just below the roofline of the building at the east and west facing corner facades. A superimposed rendering is attached. The sign will also be "halo" lit, similar to that for Mile One Stadium.

The Committee recommends approval of the sign as submitted.

5. **Byrne Building – 362 Water St. (Designated Property) – Sign Application**

The Committee considered a sign application for the above-noted property which is proposed to be situated on the front and corner sides of the building. A superimposed rendering is attached.

The Committee recommends rejection of the proposed sign and that signage must be installed within the existing signage band as per Section 6 (e) of the Heritage Area Sign By-Law, and not protrude as proposed.

6. **30 Queen's Road (Designated Property) Installation of Wrought Iron Fence**

The Committee considered the proposal for the installation of a wrought iron fence at 30 Queen's Road which is a heritage designated property.

The Committee recommends approval of the application as submitted.

7. 32 Queen's Road (Designated Property)

The Committee considered an application for the proposed renovations to install asphalt shingles and an insulated steel door at the rear. It was noted that this is a provincially heritage designated building which has a Heritage Foundation easement. If the applicant is willing to replace the steel door with a wooden door at the rear, he may be entitled to funding from the Heritage Foundation to offset this cost.

The Committee expressed no objection to the proposed renovations outlined, pending approval by the Heritage Foundation which has a heritage easement on this property.

8. 28 Water St.

The Committee considered the finish of an exterior wall situated at 28 Water St. The brick wall has been covered with vinyl siding (cove style), which contravenes the City's original permit to repair (as opposed to cover) the brick wall.

The Committee recommends that the brick wall be fixed as per the conditions outlined in the original building permit issued. The Committee is also receptive to an alternate acceptable proposal which ensures adequate repairs to the exterior wall.
