The Regular Meeting of the St. John's Municipal Council was held in the Council Chamber, City Hall, at 4:30 p.m. today.

His Worship the Mayor presided.

There were present also Deputy Mayor Duff, Councillors O'Leary, Hickman, Hann, Breen, Galgay, Tilley, Hanlon and Collins

The City Manager, the Deputy City Manager/Director of Corporate Services and City Clerk; the Deputy City Manager/Director of Engineering, Development Engineer, City Solicitor and Manager, Corporate Secretariat were also in attendance.

Call to Order and Adoption of the Agenda

It was decided on motion of Councillor Tilley; seconded by Councillor Galgay: That the Agenda be adopted as presented.

Adoption of Minutes

It was decided on motion of Councillor Galgay; seconded by Councillor Breen: That the minutes of the November 23rd, 2009 meeting be adopted as presented.

Notices Published

1. Variance of Non-Conforming Use Application has been submitted by Hampton Architects Inc. requesting permission to convert a portion of the subject building at Civic No. 414 Blackmarsh Road from its current use, Murray's Antiques, to professional offices for ten (10 employees). The change of use would entail changing the existing ground floor space and the back portion of the second floor to office space, while maintaining the second storey residential apartment. The

furniture restoration building at the rear of the property will be maintained and continue to operate. The parking lot will be expanded and upgraded to provide nine (9) parking spaces. (Ward 3)

SJMC2009-11-30/669R It was moved by Deputy Mayor Duff; seconded by Councillor Tilley: That the application be approved.

The motion being put was unanimously carried.

Other Business

Councillor Hann again raised the issue surrounding offshore search and rescue. He indicated that he was "heartened" to hear a CBC news story concerning the issue and the fact that military documents obtained by CBC show how search and rescue in St. John's could improve coverage for the offshore oil industry. The military's own studies obtained through access to information show that the response time for a Cormorant Helicopter to a Cougar incident is at least forty-five minutes faster from St. John's. The report released in 2000 says responding from St. John's to a potential Cougar incident would be better than from Gander. Councillor Hann pointed out that St. John's isn't "pitting" itself against Gander but that Council unanimously approved a motion in April 2009 calling on DND to establish search and rescue unit in St. John's in addition to Gander. Councillor Hann also pointed out that Newfoundland's Federal MPs have raised the matter in the House of Commons, Liberal MP Judy Foote presented a private members bill calling for a unit to be established in St. John's which was passed. Premier Williams has strongly supported the issue, and Mr. Robert Wells, Commissioner for the offshore helicopter safety inquiry, asked DND for representation at the hearing.

Councillor Hann thanked Council for its previous support and its continued support as the matter moves forward.

1. Grants to Artists

The Committee discussed the idea of increasing grants to artists. The current allocation is \$1.00 per capita for an approximate total of \$101,000 annually. Last year, the City received over \$273,000 worth of applications from artists, significantly higher than the funding allocated. Reference was also made to the recently adopted Municipal Arts Plan from which the following quote was cited:

"Artistic Activity is a major and varied contributor to economic vitality... (The) productivity of earnings in a regional economy rise as the incidence of artists within its boundaries increases, because artists' creativity and specialized skills enhance the design, production, and marketing of products and services in other sectors. They also help firms recruit top-rate employees and generate income through direct exports of artistic work out of the region."

The Artistic Dividend: The Arts' Hidden Contributions to Regional Development, University of Minnesota.

The Committee on motion of Frank Fagan; seconded by Kelly Davis: recommends that Council consider increasing the allocated arts grants fund by 50% per year over the next two year period of 2010 and 2011. This would see the current grant allocation increasing from \$1.00 to \$1.50 per capita in 2010 and from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per capita in 2011. This would amount to a total amount in 2011 of approximately \$200,000.

2. <u>Public Art Advisory Committee (Report of August 19th, 2009, attached)</u>

The Committee considered the attached report of the Public Art Advisory Committee dated August 19th, 2009, outlining a number of recommendations for the Arts Advisory Committee's review:

The Committee recommends that the report be adopted by Council with the exception of item #'s 1 and 5 and that recommendation # 13 be revised to stipulate a resolution of 300 dpi (and not 72).

It was moved by Councillor Hickman; seconded by Deputy Mayor Duff: That Committee recommendation #1, Grants to Artists, be referred to 2010 budget discussions, and that Item #2, Public Art Advisory Committee Repot of August 19th, 2009, be adopted as presented.

During discussion, Councillor Hickman commented on a seminar held last week with Mr. Reid Henrick from Local Projects in Toronto, which provided valuable information to the arts community from three levels of government, from the corporate sector, as well as downtown building owners. His presentation on various work carried out in other cities throughout Canada and North America shows the viability and value of converting older spaces to not only arts spaces, but incubator spaces, office spaces, studio spaces etc. Councillor Hickman advised that the information will be useful to the Artists Infrastructure Committee which is a subsidiary of the arts advisory committee, as the City eventually moves forward towards finding a type of facility suitable to the City's needs. He further noted there is a federal program that will provide up to 1/3 of the funding and has been extended for five years

Following discussion, the motion being put was unanimously carried.

Councillor Collins

Councillor Collins noted that Mr. Harold Druken is stepping down as chair of the Board of Directors of the Shea Heights Community Centre. He commended him on his significant contribution to the community of Shea Heights. Councillor Hann asked that the Mayor write a letter of commendation to Mr. Druken on behalf of Council. Council agreed.

Councillor Hanlon

Councillor Hanlon tabled a letter from R. F. Gosine, on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Allandale Place Condominium Corporation, concerning a flooding incident that occurred at 90 Allandale Place on November 16, 2009.

The matter was referred to the Public Works, Environment and Protection Standing Committee for follow-up.

Councillor Tilley

Councillor Tilley asked that a letter of congratulations be forwarded to Deputy Chief of Operations, Jack Hickey, who represented the St. John's Regional Fire Department at the 2009 World's Combat Challenge during the week of November 16th to 20th. This year he teamed up with Cyril Fraser of the Halifax Regional and Emergency Services to win and set a new World Record in the "Over 50" Tandem competition.

Councillor Tilley advised that he spoke to the Director of Engineering about the temporary traffic lights at the Canada Drive/Columbus Drive intersection which were installed following a traffic incident and was advised that permanent lights will be installed as soon as insurance issues are resolved.

Councillor Tilley asked if the Police and Traffic Committee would convene in the absence of the Chair due to a number of outstanding agenda items. Council agreed that a meeting be convened and that Councillor Hanlon act as Chair.

Councillor Galgay

Councillor Galgay commended the organizers, volunteers, groups and organizations for their contribution towards another very successful annual Downtown Santa Claus Parade.

Councillor Breen

Councillor Breen tabled an email dated November 24, 2009 from Nancy Constantine noting that she is unable to let her small dog run free at the Quidi Vidi Lake dog park for fear of being trampled by larger dogs. She asked if the City has plans for a dog park suitable for smaller dogs. The matter was referred to the Parks and Recreation Standing Committee for comment.

Councillor O'Leary

Councillor O'Leary advised that in future artists will have the option of submitting their submissions in digital format.

Councillor O'Leary noted that she has received numerous calls and emails on a proposal by Fortis to build an office tower in the downtown. She advised the public that the City has not received a formal application on this proposed development.
