## RESOLUTION ST. JOHN'S DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AMENDMENT NUMBER 470, 2009

**WHEREAS** the City of St. John's wishes to modify the provisions of Section 7.22 – "Taverns and Eating Establishments".

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED** that the City of St. John's hereby adopts the following text amendment to the St. John's Development Regulations, pursuant to the provisions of the Urban and Rural Planning Act.

**Repeal Section 7.22** ("Taverns and Eating Establishments") and substitute the following new section.

- "1) No Tavern shall be permitted within 50 metres of the Newfoundland War Memorial;
- 2) No Tavern or Eating Establishment shall be permitted on the property situate between Airport Road and Portugal Cove Road which property was the subject of the St. John's Development Regulations Amendment Number 325, 2004;
- 3) An application for a Tavern shall be processed as a Discretionary Use where a Tavern is proposed to be located within 150 metres of a Church, a School or a Residential Zone or an Apartment Zone;
- 4) An application for a Tavern at a property located in the Downtown Business Improvement Area shall be processed as a Discretionary Use excepting those properties abutting George Street, between Queen Street and Water Street as more particularly described in Map K, Section 3 of these Regulations where a Tavern shall be a Permitted Use; and
- 5) An application for an outdoor eating area and/or a drive-thru associated with an Eating Establishment shall be processed as a Discretionary Use where the

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Eating Establishment is located within 150 metres of a Church, a School or a Residential Zone or an Apartment Zone."

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City of St. John' requests the Minister of Municipal Affairs to register the proposed amendment in accordance with the requirements of the Urban and Rural Planning Act, 2000.

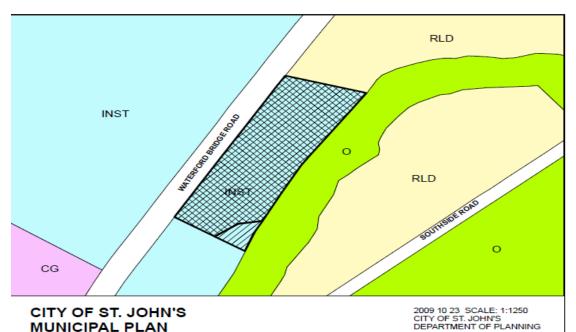

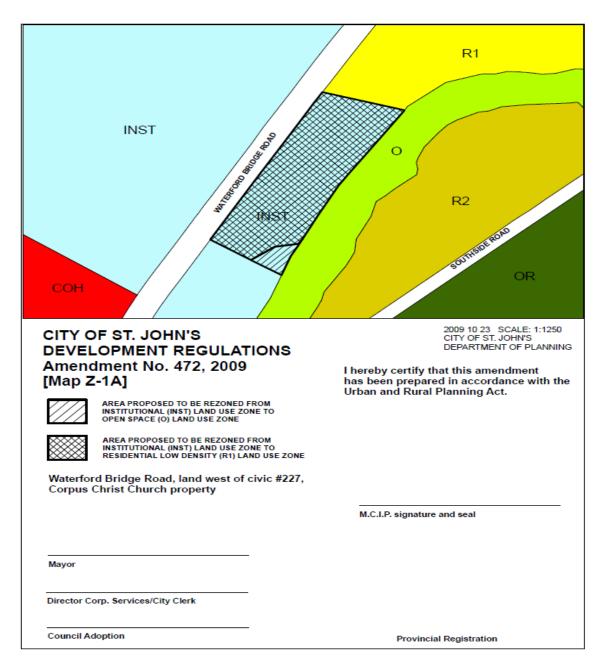

<u>WHEREAS</u> the City of St. John's Municipal Council is empowered under the provisions of the City of St. John's (Loan) Act, 1978, as amended, to borrow money on the credit of the City by the issue and sale of bonds of the City subject to the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs;

AND WHEREAS the Council deems it advisable to issue and sell bonds in an amount of Twenty-Seven Million Dollars (\$27,000,000) under the said Act for the purpose of repayment of loans of the City used as interim financing for the construction of the Riverhead Waste Water Treatment Plant and the 2008-2010 Multi-Year Capital Works Program and to seek the approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs to issue and sell bonds in the said amount for the said purpose;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the required approval of the Minister of Municipal Affairs, be sought to issue and sell bonds in the amount of Twenty-Seven Million Dollars (\$27,000,000) the proceeds of such sale to be applied towards the repayment of those loans of the City.

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referred to the Parks and Recreation Committee for investigation. Acting Mayor Duff asked that the City's plan for Bannerman and Victoria Parks be brought forward to a future meeting of the committee.
