Air Canada

Under section 7.1 of the Department of Transport Act the Minister of Transport has the authority, with the approval of the Governor in Council, to have an enquiry conducted into any matters he is authorized to deal with under the Canada Transportation Act. Alternatively, the Minister has the power under section 489 of the Canada Transportation Act to direct the Canada

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Transportation Agency to "enquire into any matter concerning transportation", which the Chief Commissioner and City Solicitor noted might be the best approach although Council can put both alternatives to the Minister.

Council agreed with the approach put forward by the Chief Commissioner & City Solicitor, that before proceeding with the public inquiry by the Federal Transport Department, Council ask the general public to forward their detailed experiences and complaints to the City Clerk or directly to the Office of the Mayor, which would be forwarded to the Minister in support of the City's request. He noted however, that before proceeding, the City's request would have much more force if specific complaints were obtained which could be forwarded to the Minister in support of the City's request.
