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Councillor O'Leary

Councillor O'Leary stated that the first coyote information session was very successful and more information is available on the City's website.

She inquired as to when the Municipal Plan should be completed. As it is pending legal review, the City Solicitor replied it should be completed by June of this year.

Councillor O'Leary also voiced concerns for lower income families dealing with the ramifications of the Provincial Budget, stating that the City must keep this in mind going forward.

Mayor O'Keefe

Mayor O'Keefe stated he has written Minister Joyce to ascertain the status of the Northeast Avalon Regional Plan and is awaiting his reply.

Mayor O'Keefe also reminded residents that as of April 1st residents are required to cover their garbage.
