#### Higher sales at NL restaurants

On a seasonally adjusted basis, sales in the food services and drinking places subsector increased 4.9% to \$73.1 million in January 2019 in Newfoundland and Labrador compared to the previous year. Unadjusted year-over-year sales in January in the following industry groups increased: limited-service restaurants (+6.2%) and at full-service restaurants (+4.5%). Statistics Canada.



# City Building Permits (year to date)

As of April 1, 2019 the value of:

- Commercial permits were up 32% to \$40,100,449 for 2019 over \$30,276,339 for 2018
- Industrial permits were down from \$5,000 in 2018 to \$0 in 2019
- Government/Institutional permits were down from \$2,000,000 in 2018 to \$0 in 2019\*
- Residential permits were down 73% over 2018: \$5,824,936 for 2019 over \$22,019,767 for 2018
- Repair permits were down 32%, from \$306,550 in 2018 to \$209,750 in 2019
- Total value of all permits was down 15% to \$46,153,135 for 2019 over \$54,607,656 for 2018 \* Note that this data doe not include the full range of permit activity undertaken by the provincial government and Memorial

University.

#### TRAPPED escape room, 152 Water St. Cruise ship traffic expected to grow Green Sleeves Uptown, 411 Torbay Rd.

The Port of St. John's is expected to see a 58% increase in cruise ship visits this year. More than 40,000 passengers and about 16,700 crew are set to visit the capital city between April and October onboard 38 ships. There were 24 actual cruise visits in 2018 as three ships had to cancel. Cruise vessels are coming earlier in the spring and visiting later in autumn, increasing the length of the cruise season. There are two planned overnight stops this season as well. The City continues to work with Cruise NL to build relationships with cruise lines and to market St. John's as a port of call.
