# Business Briefs

### Verafin secures the largest ever venture deal in Canadian history

St. John's based fintech company <u>Verafin</u> has secured a \$515 million equity-and-debt deal, what the *Globe and Mail* is calling the biggest venture deal in Canadian history. The company provides lenders with software to detect and prevent fraud and money-laundering. Its annualized recurring revenue hit \$100 million in the first quarter of 2019 – up 87% from two years earlier. More than 3,000 banks and credit unions in the U.S. are now clients, including 25 with more than \$5 billion in assets. The deal allows the management and employees to be the largest shareholder group in the company, even after this latest half-a-billion injection. Verafin continues its stellar growth while remaining based in St. John's, where it employs more than 500 people. The company puts a lot of time and resources into employee training when they find the right people, which also helps them solve the skills-shortage problem facing so many high-tech businesses in the Atlantic region.

### The number of startups in Atlantic Canada increases

Entrevestor, a website that provides news and data on Atlantic Canada innovators, has released its Atlantic Canadian *Startup Data Report 2018*. According to the release, startups (their word for high-growth innovation companies) in Atlantic Canada attracted a record \$166.6 million in private capital in 2018, while increasing their revenues and adding about 1,000 employees. Entrevestor found 550 high-growth, innovation-driven companies in the region. There were a record 115 new companies and 66 failures in 2018. In the St. John's area (all the NL companies tracked are based in eastern Newfoundland), 24 new companies were launched in 2018 for a total of 69 companies in the ecostystem covered by the report, up from 28 companies in 2013. The oceantech sector, boosted by Canada's Ocean Supercluster, is now home to a young, vibrant group of ocean technology startups in Atlantic Canada. City Building Permits (year to date)

As of October 7, 2019 the value of:

- Commercial permits were down -48% from \$227,993,647 in 2018 to \$118,938,171 in 2019
- Industrial permits were valued at \$5,000 for 2018 and \$1,737,266 for 2019
- Government/Institutional permits were down from \$12,683,470 in 2018 to \$2,440,150 in 2019\*
- Residential permits were down -42% to \$34,420,805 for 2019 over \$59,497,500 for 2018
- **Repair** permits were down -25%, from \$2,191,900 in 2018 to \$2,028,458 in 2019

• **Total** value of all permits was down -47% to \$159,564,851 for 2019 over \$302,371,517 for 2018 \* Note that this data does not include the full range of permit activity undertaken by the provincial government and Memorial University.
