St. John's MapCentre

Do you need to find a City street or the ward that you reside in, land use planning information or assessment values for your property?

The City provides access to municipal information through an interactive map called the Mapcentre offering access to quick, ready-to-use geospatial data in an interactive way. The web mapping application (APP) allows users to view planning information, compare aerial imagery, construct a profile or view parcels without having to contact City staff. Business and property owners or developers in St. John's can also obtain spatial information before or during the building application process.

Users have the ability to change the basemap to a topographic basemap, and the APP includes a pictometry section featuring some great aerial photography.

Construction Permit Counter Moving to the Annex

Effective Monday, January 4, 2021 the Construction Permit Counter located at <u>Access St. John's</u> (first floor of City Hall), will be relocating across the street to the Inspection Services Division, third floor of the John J. Murphy building (City Hall Annex). This change in location will improve efficiency by

Business Briefs

Nasdaq Buying Verafin in US\$2.75 Billion Deal

Global technology giant Nasdaq will acquire St. John's based software developer <u>Verafin</u> for (USD)\$2.75 billion in cash. The agreement will combine Verafin's comprehensive suite of anti-financial crime management products with Nasdaq's reach and establish regulatory technology leadership to create a global leader in the fight against financial crime. Verafin, created by three Memorial University engineering graduates, got its start at the university's business incubator, <u>Genesis</u>. The agreement commits Nasdaq to work closely with Memorial and the company has committed to investing (USD)\$1 million in a research and development partnership project with Genesis.

<u>Tech NL</u>, the province's technology and innovation sector association, predicts the deal will see capital investments spill over into other tech firms, motivating startups and bringing international skilled workers to St. John's.

New Immigration Pathway to Attract Newcomers to Stay

The <u>Government of Newfoundland and Labrador</u> has announced a new immigration pathway to focus on retention. <u>Priority Skills Newfoundland and Labrador</u> will target newcomers with either a Memorial University Masters Degree or PhD in a number of high-demand areas—or those who have at least one year of work experience in those areas, can apply for the program, which will get them their residency faster. Launching on January 2, 2021, the pathway will attract highly educated, highly skilled newcomers with specialized experience working in sectors such as technology, where a growing demand has outpaced local training and recruitment.

COVID-19 Support Programs Update

Government expands Canada Emergency Business Account

As Canadian businesses continue to navigate the economic uncertainties and operational limitations brought on by the pandemic, the Government of Canada has expanded the CEBA loan program. As of December 4, 2020, eligible businesses facing financial hardship as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic are able to access a second CEBA loan of up to \$20,000 – on top

of the initial \$40,000 that was available to small businesses. To apply, eligible businesses and not-for-profits need to contact the financial institution that provided their initial CEBA loan and provide the appropriate information and documentation. Read more here.

City of St. John's Building Permits

As of December 7, 2020:

Commercial permits were down 23% from \$174,434,734.16 in 2019 to \$134,995,077.71 in 2020

Industrial permits were valued at \$1,812,266.07 for 2019 and \$3,000 for 2020

Government/Institutional permits were valued at \$2,824,650.00 in 2019 and \$677,431.00 for 2020*

Residential permits were up 4% to \$48,170,589.83 for 2020 over

\$46,220,510.75 for 2019

Repair permits were up 68%, from \$2,287,433.50 in 2019 to \$3,347,253.90 in 2020

Total value of all permits was down 18% to \$187,193,352.44 for 2020 over \$227,579,594.48 for 2019

*Note that this data does not include the full range of permit activity undertaken by the provincial government and Memorial University.
