# **Business Briefs**



### **City Announces Two Business Support Initiatives**

The City of St. John's is extending the deadline for both the January 2020 payment period for commercial billing and the commercial vacancy allowance claim period due to the recent state of emergency. For the **Commercial Business Tax**, the January 31 payment deadline is being extended to February 28, 2020. Payments made during the extension period (February 1 to 28) will be applied to your account with a January 31 payment date thereby allowing businesses an extra 28 days to avoid interest they would have been otherwise charged on January 31. To take advantage of this extension, payments must be received by 4:30 p.m. on Friday. Feb. 28. For **Vacancy Allowance Claims**, the deadline for filing vacancy allowance claims is being extended. Claims for the third and fourth quarters of 2019 normally due January 31 will now be accepted up to and including February 14, 2020.

### St. John's 2019 Tourism Indicators

- The 2019 cruise season saw 37 port calls to St. John's bringing 40,499 passengers to the city.
- Preliminary numbers indicate 619,224 hotel room nights were sold in 2019, an increase of 2.3% over 2018. The average daily room rate was \$132.07 and the overall occupancy rate was 56%.
- The number of airline passenger movements at St. John's International Airport decreased to 1,450,388 (or 3.8%) compared to 2018.

### City of St. John's Major Construction Projects 2019

- Office building, 20 Hebron Way: \$13.0
- Avalon Mall renos, 48 Kenmount Road: \$21.3
- Cannabis facility, 50 Captain Prim Drive: \$25.0



# City Building Permits (year to date)

As of February 3, 2020 the value of:

- Commercial permits were up 119% from \$3,093,941 in 2019 to \$6,768,952 in 2020
- Industrial permits were valued at \$0 for 2019 and \$0 for 2020
- Government/Institutional permits were at \$0 in 2019 and \$0 for 2020\*
- Residential permits were down -26% to \$1,154,821 for 2020 over \$1,563,880 for 2019
- Repair permits were down -100%, from \$98,750 in 2019 to \$0 in 2020
- Total value of all permits was up 67% to \$7,923,773 for 2020 over \$4,756,571 for 2019
