News Briefs

Major Film Production Coming to Newfoundland and Labrador

The Walt Disney Company is going to film a portion of the major motion picture *Peter Pan and Wendy* in the province. The government of Newfoundland and Labrador will provide a 30% rebate on production costs up to \$3-million; however, it estimates that the eligible total spend in the province will be approximately \$9 million. A cast and crew of approximately 150, including local technicians, artists, and film workers, will be employed locally. The film and television industry is a significant economic driver and employer in Newfoundland and Labrador.

Atlantic Canada Startup Data 2020

The latest research report from Entrevestor on the Atlantic Canadian startup community shows that St. John's accounts for 20% of all new startup creation in Atlantic Canada. St. John's was noted as the fastest–growing startup centre. With business support agencies like the Memorial Centre for Entrepreneurship, Bounce Health Innovation and Genesis all working together, the number of startups in St. John's has increased almost 150% in five years. The sale of St. John's fintech company Verafin to Nasdaq for US\$2.75 billion in 2020 proved that entrepreneurs can build a billion–dollar company in Atlantic Canada.

The report states, "The innovation community centred in St. John's features a host of elite companies like Celtex and CoLab Software that are continuing to grow, as well as scaling companies like Clockwork Fox Studios, which exited in 2021, and young, exciting companies like Swiftsure Innovations and BreatheSuite." Public Procurement Agency Seeking Input from Businesses to Improve Procurement Legislation

In 2020, the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador through the Public Procurement Agency (PPA) announced increased procurement thresholds, as well as a local preference provision, to the Public Procurement Regulations. These measures were introduced to allow for more opportunities to direct business to local suppliers through a limited call process and by enhancing local competitiveness. PPA is now consulting with provincial businesses on ways to further improve the local preference provision to allow for more opportunities to direct business to local suppliers, which will strengthen the provincial economy. Participants are asked to provide feedback on a variety of topics, including what tools government should use to enhance and improve local preference. Government of NL - Business Development Support Program update

The <u>Business Development Support Program</u> assists Newfoundland and Labrador businesses with opportunities to increase their productivity and improve their competitiveness. The program supports SMEs who demonstrate a desire to develop and grow by improving the operations of the business, investing in its people, and focusing on trade opportunities. Funding is available for productivity improvements, knowledge development, market development and/or professional technical advice. Contribution levels have been temporarily increased for eligible project applications. Eligible costs will now be covered up to 75%, up from 50%, for applications received by September 30, 2021. As of October 1, 2021, this temporary measure will no longer be in effect.

City of St. John's Building Permits

As of June 28, 2021:

Commercial permits were up 15% from \$76,695,998.49 in 2020 to \$88,213,084.54 in 2021

Industrial permits were valued at \$3,000.00 for 2020 and \$4,147,500.00 for 2021

Government/Institutional permits were up \$136,500.00 in 2020 to \$1,149,941.00 in 2021*

Residential permits were up 76% \$23,816,484.20 for 2021 over \$13,544,215.05 for 2020

Repair permits were up from \$645,815.00 in 2020 to \$2,985,242.50 in 2021

Total value of all permits was **up 32%** to \$120,312,252.24 for 2021 over \$91,025,528.54 for 2020
