Newfoundland and Labrador launches renewable energy plan

The government of Newfoundland and Labrador has launched its renewable energy plan, titled 'Maximizing Our Renewable Future'. The five-year plan has four specific focus areas: energy uses and markets; regulatory framework; partnerships, innovation and industry support; and training and jobs. Newfoundland and Labrador has an abundance of renewable energy resources which positions the province well to meet its net-zero commitments, fight climate change, and to grow clean energy jobs and economic development. New Permanent Atlantic Immigration Program (AIP)

Following the success of the Atlantic Immigration Pilot Program, the federal government has made it a permanent program. Immigration, Refugees, Citizenship Canada will release details on the program and will resume accepting applications under the AIP om March 6, 2022.

AIP has been successful in supporting employers in Newfoundland and Labrador in fulfilling their workforce needs. It also contributed to immigrant retention, with nearly 85 per cent of principal applicants choosing to remain in Newfoundland and Labrador. To assist future applicants gain a better understanding of the new program, the Office of Immigration and Multiculturalism has arranged two online information sessions, on January 12 and 19, respectively. Genesis Evolution Seeks Applicants

Thinking about a tech business idea? You may want to consider applying for this winter's Evolution program at Genesis innovation hub in St. John's. The eight-week intensive program is designed for tech start-ups which have less than \$1 million in annual revenue and have yet to develop a minimum viable product. With experiential learning at its core, Evolution helps entrepreneurs engage potential customers, while receiving mentorship from Genesis' advisor network. City Building Permits

As of December 31, 2021

Commercial permits

were down -12% from \$137,152,004.05 in 2020 to \$120,769,155.40 in 2021

Industrial permits

were valued at \$3,000.00 for 2020 and \$4,164,500.00 for 2021

Government/Institutional permits

were up from \$804,490.10 in 2020 to \$34,894,428.00 in 2021*

Residential permits

were up 24% to \$63,672,770.08 for 2021 over \$51,508,048.87 for 2020

Repair permits

were up 39% from \$3,436,653.90 in 2020 over \$4,768,937.57 in 2021

Total value of all permits for 2021

was **up 18%** to \$228,269,791.05 for 2021 over \$192,904,196.92 for 2020
