Beginning on Tuesday, May 19, the Residential Drop Off at Robin Hood Bay will now accept bulk garbage items; this is in addition to bagged garbage and metal, announced May 11. Access will be restricted to respect physical distancing requirements - please anticipate longer than normal delays.

Robin Hood Bay will accept yard waste beginning May 25. Full details here.

Government of Canada - Covid-19 Support Program Updates:

Regional Relief and Recovery Fund

The Government of Canada recognizes that some businesses and organizations have not been able to access all Federal emergency support measures. That is why it created the \$962 million Regional Relief and Recovery Fund to address these gaps.

The Atlantic Canada Opportunities Agency and the Atlantic Association of Community Business Development Corporations are distributing the \$110 million allotted to Atlantic Canadian businesses and communities.

The Federal Government is also expanding the <u>Business Credit Availability Program</u> for mid-sized companies, which will include loans of up to \$60 million and guarantees of up to \$80 million.

The <u>Canada Emergency Business Account</u> (CEBA) has been expanded to include many owner-operated small businesses. The changes to the CEBA will allow more Canadian small businesses to access interest free loans that will help cover operating costs during a period when revenues have been reduced, due to the pandemic.

Large Employer Emergency Financing

The Federal Government has announced a <u>Large Employer Emergency Financing</u> facility bridge loan for businesses across industry sectors, including not-for-profit businesses, like airports, to help them support their operations and employees.

The program is for large companies, except those in the financial sector, with an annual revenue of about \$300 million, with significant operations or workforce in Canada.

Increase Wage Support Coming for Essential Workers

Ottawa has reached a \$4-billion deal with the provinces to help boost the wages of essential workers. The Federal Government will be contributing \$3 billion while the provinces and territories make up the remainder.

The Government of Newfoundland and Labrador will participate, with further details to be released soon.

The Newfoundland Liquor Corporation (NLC) is waiving or reducing fees and taxes to help restaurants and lounges that sell alcohol. The sale of alcohol will be permitted with takeout orders. In addition, the NLC will allow brewers, wineries and distilleries the ability to offer home delivery.

Through the program, the OSC will invest up to \$35 million in short-term ocean projects to help continue to build resiliency in ocean sectors during this challenging time. This will supplement the OSC's core programs in Technology Leadership and Innovation Ecosystem, and is intended to trigger additional industry investment in innovation, capability-building, and helping build resilience in the ocean economy. Stingray has announced the establishment of an economic stimulus plan to provide a minimum of \$15 million in radio advertising grants to local businesses in markets across Canada where Stingray operates local radio stations.
