Government of Canada - Covid-19 Support Programs

To support small businesses and those impacted during the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the Government of Canada has established the following measures:

<u>Canada's Emergency Response Benefit (CERB)</u> – may provide you with temporary income support. The CERB provides \$500 a week for up to 16 weeks.

Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy - wage subsidy of 75% for the first \$58,700 normally earned by employees – representing a benefit of up to \$847 per week. Eligible employers would include employers of all sizes and across all sectors of the economy.

Business Credit Availability Program - to provide \$65 Billion of additional support through the Business Development Bank of Canada and Export Development Canada.

While also extending the Work-Sharing program & allowing businesses to defer GST/HST payments. For a full roundup of relevant supports, **visit Canada.ca**;

Water Street Construction Project to Proceed

The Water Street construction project between Ayre's Cove and Clift's Baird's Cove is proceeding as scheduled from April to June 2020. Occupational Health and Safety measures will be implemented based on the latest guidelines recommended for COVID-19.

Impact Support for Residents & Businesses from the City of St. John's

City of St. John's, Tax Relief:

Effective immediately, the City will not be charging interest on residential and commercial property taxes and water tax (Up to and including August 31, 2020).

Commercial property vacancy allowance claim has been extended. Claims for the first quarter, typically due on April 30th are not due until May 31, 2020.
