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




Real GDP Growth With and Without Oil & Gas St. John's CMA (%)

The Hebron project began oil production November 27, 2017. Newfoundland and Labrador's offshore has 3.9 billion barrels of discovered oil reserves/ resources, of which 1.7 billion barrels has already been produced.







#### **Office Market Rental Rates**


Office market rental rates remained on par in the first quarter of 2018 at \$34.98 per sq. ft.; however, they have increased 69% over the last ten years.





#### **Office Vacancy Rates**

Overall office vacancy rates rose slightly in 2018 reaching 20.2%, an increase of over 50% from Q1 2016. An additional 358,028 sq. ft. of office space has been completed and occupied over the last couple of years.


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#### **Building Permits**

The City of St. John's issued over \$272 million in building permits in 2017, an increase of 15.6% over 2016. The value of commercial permits increased by 32% to \$173 million in 2017.

Investment in non-residential\* building construction in the St. John's CMA reached \$70 million in the fourth quarter of 2017, up 46% from the fourth quarter of 2016.




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#### **Annual Unemployment Rate**

For larger households, this amount was adjusted upward by multiplying it by the square root of household size. Persons in a private household with after-tax income below this threshold were considered to be in low income.







The percentage of the population of Newfoundland and Labrador living in St. John's CMA continues to grow.



It is forecasted that the number of households will increase at a greater rate than the population.





An Aging Population: The portion of the population aged 65 and over grows while the 20-64 age group declines.















Retail Sales (\$B) - St. John's CMA 2007 - 2017





The number of vessel arrivals decreased to 1,344 in 2017 while total port cargo also decreased.



#### **Outlook for 2018**



- Conference Board of Canada forecasts real GDP growth of 2.5% for St. John's in 2018, the 3<sup>rd</sup> highest of cities in Canada due to the start of production at the Hebron offshore oil field.
- The start of construction on Husky's wellhead platform should offset the decline in capital investment somewhat as the Hebron and Long Harbour projects move past peak construction.
- NL government deficit reduction measures are expected to curtail expenditures in the public sector.
- NL Department of Finance expects economic activity to be relatively unchanged from 2017, forecasting Real GDP growth of 0.7%.
